The Palmer Community Development Director will conduct a Public Hearing on Monday, February 13, 2023, at 5:30 PM in the meeting room of the Town Administration Building, 4417 Main Street, Palmer, MA. If the Town Hall is closed due to inclement weather or for any other reason on that date, the Public Hearing will be held on the next night of Tuesday, February 14, 2023, at the same time and location.

The purpose of this Public Hearing is to solicit input relative to the development and submission of a grant application under the FY 22/23 CDBG Program. 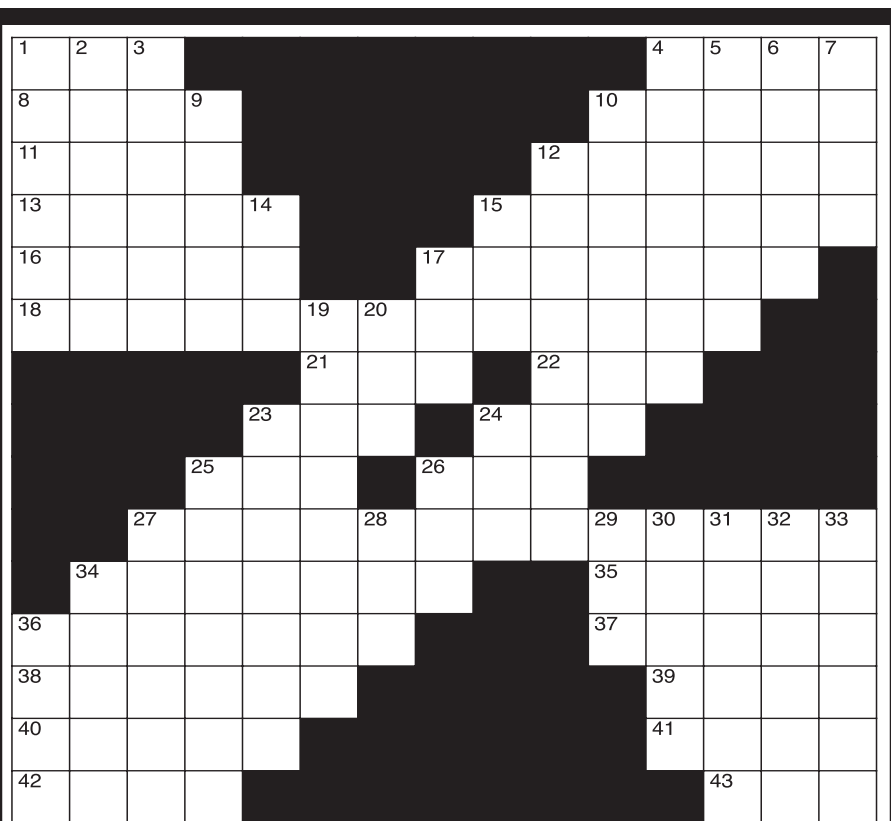
