tration is required. Donations are welcome John Dickson served 26 years in the Foreign Service, representing the U.S. in five different Embassies. After retiring, in 2010, Dickson completed graduate studies in the Public History Program at the University of Massachusetts. There, he completed a thesis on the preservation of the old Berkshire Athenaeum, the subject of a movie he filmed working with Pittsfield Community Television.

Currently, Dickson is active in local history projects in western Massachusetts where he serves as Chair of the Pittsfield Historical Commission and former board member of the Berkshire Historical Society. He has authored a local history book, Berkshire County's Industrial Heritage, on the 19th century mills in this corner of Massachusetts. His book, "History Shock," narrating personal accounts of the intersection of history and international affairs, was published by University of Kansas Press. He has taught at the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute and has three history-related websites: history-all-around.org, preservepittsfield.org and milltour.

Otis Preservation Trust works with the Otis Historical Commission to organize and preserve the history and heritage of Otis for future generations by supporting efforts to preserve, restore, repurpose and educate about buildings, monuments, lands and memorabilia of Otis.
